Sport Management student lands exciting co-op with local team

WATERBURY, Conn. (Feb. 22, 2011) – Frantzy Noze, a senior Sport Management major at Post University, has been selected to participate in a co-op experience with the New Britain Rock Cats, a Double-A minor league baseball affiliate of the Minnesota Twins Major League Baseball club.

Noze, of Norwich, says he is excited to exercise both the skills he's acquired from his studies and his passion for sports through hands-on work with a well-established team. "I'm very thankful for this opportunity and eager to see where it will lead me in the future," he said. Noze also interned with the Women's National Basketball Association's Connecticut Sun last year. The co-op experience requires students to work for an organization for 40 hours per week for a minimum of 12 weeks. Noze's responsibilities include coordinating sponsor voucher programs, street marketing campaign, ticket promotion, and stadium operations. He will be actively involved in game-day operations once the season starts.

"It's a wonderful opportunity for Frantzy to take his in-the-classroom learning and apply it to a full-time work experience in real world," said Deron Grabel, Academic Program Manager of the Post University's Sport Management Program. "He's a hardworking student and I'm confident that his dedication will serve him well, now and in the future."

Grabel said that co-ops in the sports industry are a great way to break into this competitive career field.
