Dr. William McDonald is Post University's Vice President of Academic Affairs. Dr. McDonald also is a retired special agent, U.S. Treasury, who served 21 years as part of the Metropolitan Police in Washington, DC, the U.S. Treasury Department, and the State of Connecticut.

Prior to joining Post University, Dr. McDonald was the Academic Dean and co-founder of Monroe College-St. Lucia, West Indies. He was the founder and first Dean of the College's School of Criminal Justice in New York City and has held academic affiliations with a number of American and British institutions, including the John Jay College of Criminal Justice, Excelsior College, the State University of New York, Tunxis Community College, Allegany College, University of Dundee, Bramshill -The Police Staff College of England and Wales, and University of Delaware.

He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from American University, a Master of Science Degree in Public Safety Administration from Central Connecticut State University, a graduate diploma in Criminal Justice Education from the University of Virginia, and both a Masters of Philosophy and a Doctorate of Philosophy in Criminal Justice from the City University of New York, where he was a Neiderhoffer Fellow.

A research consultant for the U.S. National Institute of Justice, he is the author of numerous works on comparative criminal justice issues and modernization of police services in developing countries. He has worked with criminal justice agencies and academic institutions in Europe, Africa, Central America, and the Caribbean. Dr. McDonald also is a graduate of the FBI National Academy.
